

PLACES OF INTEREST IN PEFKOS

Lee Beach (Pefkos Main Beach)

The main beach in Pefkos, ideal for swimming and sunbathing; watersports and boat hire available; plenty of sunbeds and umbrellas for hire and restaurants, snackbars and shops within easy reach. This is a fine sandy beach which gradually slopes gently into the sea – the water is shallow for around 20m from shore then slowly increases in depth. This beach has won Blue Flag status. Accessible by foot and car.

St Thomas Beach

A sheltered small bay where local fishermen moor their boats. Good for swimming, snorkelling and sunbathing; some sunbeds and umbrellas for hire. Smooth sandy beach with rockpools at one end; the water along the beach reaches several metres depth within around 10 metres from shore. Accessible by foot and car but the road back up is quite steep!

Plakia Beach

Long sandy beach which stretches along the coast leading towards Lardos. Good for swimming, snorkelling and sunbathing; sunbeds and umbrellas for hire. Refreshments available. Fine sandy beach with few rocks; the water is relatively shallow for the first 10 metres from shore. Accessible by foot and in theory by car but the road is not great!

C Fokia Bay

The last bay along the coast before Lindos which is easily accessible by foot; its name is from the Greek "fokia" which means sea lion – they are sometimes spotted in the bay; if you' re very lucky you might see one! No beach as such and no facilities here.

Kavos Beach

Suitable for swimming, sunbathing and snorkelling, Kavos beach is at the very end of Lee Beach; the two are separated only by a few rocks in the sea which you can easily walk over or around. It is a small, cove which incorporates a tiny bay where some locals moor their fishing boats. The beach is sandy and the waters beautifully clear. It is very quiet although there are some sunbeds and umbrellas for hire at one end of the beach. Please note that access is by foot and by car although there is limited parking.

🕋 Agios Nektarios Chapel

Chapel in the centre of the village, dedicated to St Nektarios; the name day is celebrated on 9th November.

Agios Ioannis Chapel

Chapel dedicated to St John the Baptist; the name day is celebrated on 6th January.

Profitis Ilias

Chapel dedicated to the Prophet Elijah: the most sacred icons from the church in Lindos are brought to the chapel in a midnight procession once each year on Maundy Thursday. The name day is celebrated on 20th July.

PLACES TO VISIT

Lindos | 4km from Pefkos

Lindos was first inhabited around 3000BC and is one of the most visited and photographed villages in the whole of Greece, a designated National Historic Landmark. The Acropolis of Lindos is perched on a sheer cliff face high above the village which comprises a maze of narrow lanes and whitewashed houses, many of which have been converted into shops, restaurants, bars and cafes. No traffic is permitted inside the village and the only mode of transport is a "Lindian taxi" (otherwise known as a donkey)!

Rhodes Old Town

The Old Town of Rhodes is a medieval walled city, a World Heritage Site, contained within 4km of walls and surrounded by moats. Eleven gates give access into the Old Town, which features a selection of museums, shops, restaurants and bars as well as the impressive Palace of the Grand Masters and several other monuments and buildings from the time of the Knights of St John, including the famous Street of the Knights.

Rhodes Town

Mandraki Harbour is the hub of Rhodes Town and the link between the Old Town and the new town. The harbour is always full of moored yachts and excursion boats. A bronze doe and stag guard the entrance to the harbour, where the Colossus of Rhodes, one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World is supposed to have stood.

Impressive Italian-designed public buildings line the harbourside and the town spreads backwards from here. The new town has a huge number of designer boutiques, shops, restaurants, bars and cafes.

TRADITIONAL RECIPES

Tzatziki

Combine olive oil, vinegar, garlic, salt, and pepper in a bowl. Mix until well combined. Using a whisk, blend the yogurt with the sour cream. Add the olive oil mixture to the yogurt mixture and mix well. Finally, add the cucumber and chopped fresh dill. Chill for at least two hours before serving. Garnish with a sprig of fresh dill just before serving.


TO SEE BUS SCHEDULE

1. Kleftiko is traditionally made in a sealed earthenware dish, but a casserole dish covered in aluminium foil will do the trick (alternatively you can make individual parcels of the meat with a layer of baking parchment and aluminium foil).

2. Preheat the oven to 150C/gas 2. Cut a piece of aluminium foil to about a metre in length. Lay the paper in a casserole dish with one half covering the base of the dish and the other hanging

3. Rub the lamb all over with the lemon wedges and put the lamb and lemon wedges into the dish. Sprinkle with salt, freshly ground black pepper, oregano and cinnamon, and add a bay leaf and the potato wedges - you can also add a few cherry tomatoes for colour.

4. Mix together all the ingredients, fold over the second half of the paper to cover the meat and transfer to the oven. Roast for 2-3 hours, or until the meat falls off the bone. Rest the meat for at least ten minutes in a warm place and serve
